Vivek Jain, MD • Neurologist

Dr. Vivek Jain is a neurologist with subspecialty training in stroke and cerebrovascular disease. A member of the Joint Commission-certified UC Irvine Stroke and Cerebrovascular Center team, he is involved in inpatient and outpatient stroke care and stroke prevention. He also is skilled in evaluation and treatment of transient ischemic attack and vascular dementia.

Jain received his medical degree from Memorial University in St. John's, Canada. He trained in internal medicine at McMaster University, followed by postgraduate training in neurology at UC Irvine and a stroke/cerebrovascular diseases fellowship at University of Western Ontario. Prior to joining UC Irvine, he was medical director of the stroke program at Kaiser Permanente-San Jose and was a member of The Permanente Medical Group in Northern California.



Neil F. Jones, MD, FRCS, FACS • Hand surgeon

Dr. Neil F. Jones is a renowned hand surgeon, recognized especially for his expertise in performing toe-to-hand transfers, procedures that have changed the lives of children born with hand defects and have restored hand function in adults affected by traumatic injury. He is highly skilled in a wide range of procedures involving microsurgery, including repair and reconstruction of nerves and tendons. He will work to establish a world-class hand center at UC Irvine Healthcare.

Jones earned his medical degree from Oxford University Medical School and trained in general, orthopaedic and neurological surgery at the Radcliffe Infirmary in Oxford, and in plastic and reconstructive surgery at University of Michigan. He completed a fellowship in microsurgery at University of Louisville, a plastic surgery fellowship at the London Hospital and St. Bartholomew's Hospital in London, and a hand surgery and microsurgery fellowship at Harvard's Massachusetts General Hospital. He comes to UC Irvine from UCLA, where he was professor and chief of hand surgery.



Antoine E. Khoury, MD • Pediatric urologist

Dr. Antoine E. Khoury, a world-renowned pediatric urologist, has been appointed chief of pediatric urology in the Department of Urology. His expertise includes all aspects of pediatric urological surgery, from pediatric renal transplantation and oncology to the most complicated intersex reconstructive procedures. He practices at both UC Irvine Medical Center and Children's Hospital of Orange County.

Khoury received his medical degree from Ain Shams Medical School in Cairo, Egypt, and completed his residency training in urology at the University of Toronto, followed by a pediatric urology fellowship at the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto and a research fellowship in infections and biomaterials at the University of Calgary. He comes to UC Irvine from the University of Toronto's Hospital for Sick Children, one of the world's foremost pediatric hospitals, where he was division head of pediatric urology.



Shaista Malik, MD, PhD, MPH • Cardiologist

Dr. Shaista Malik is a cardiologist specializing in cardiovascular imaging. Skilled in interpreting echocardiograms, stress tests, cardiac CTs and other diagnostic procedures, she is a member of the UC Irvine Healthcare women's cardiovascular health program and the preventive cardiology program. She is board-certified in internal medicine, nuclear cardiology and cardiovascular disease.

Malik earned her medical degree from UC Irvine. She also holds a master's degree in public health and a Ph.D. from UCLA. She completed a residency in internal medicine at UC Irvine, where she also completed a fellowship in cardiovascular disease, serving as chief cardiology fellow. As co-director of UC Irvine's Division of Cardiology Cardiac CT Course, Malik teaches a certification course in cardiovascular computed tomography. Her research interests are in preventive cardiology and health policy.



Margaret Mann, MD • Dermatologist

Dr. Margaret Mann is a dermatologic surgeon and vein specialist. Board certified in dermatology, she focuses on the management of skin cancer, venous disease and cosmetic surgery. Her expertise includes Mohs surgery, skin cancer reconstructive surgery and cutaneous oncology. Mann provides venous treatments including endovenous ablation, duplex ultrasound, microphlebectomy and sclerotherapy.

Mann received her medical degree from Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, where she completed a residency in dermatology and a fellowship in Mohs micrographic surgery and advanced dermatologic surgery, and also served as a clinical instructor. She is the primary investigator on several research projects on skin cancer and venous disease and is the principal author of a clinical handbook of dermatology, due to be published later this year.



Keyianoosh Z. Paydar, MD • Plastic surgeon

Dr. Keyianoosh Z. Paydar performs cosmetic and reconstructive surgery with the Aesthetic and Plastic Surgery Institute at University of California, Irvine. His special interest in cosmetic and aesthetic surgery includes facial and neck surgical procedures, as well as breast and body sculpting. He offers all types of reconstructive surgery, especially for cancer, trauma and burn patients.

Paydar received his medical degree from University of Tennessee, Memphis, and completed six years of general surgery residency and two additional years of plastic and reconstructive surgery training at University of California, San Francisco. In addition, he completed observerships in aesthetic surgery in Dallas, Miami and New York under the guidance of world-renowned cosmetic surgeons. He has research interests in wound healing.



Kevin M. Reavis, MD • Gastrointestinal surgeon

Dr. Kevin M. Reavis is fellowship-trained in minimally invasive gastrointestinal surgery. His expertise includes bariatric surgery, gastroesophageal reflux, Barrett's esophagus, and diseases of the esophagus, stomach, intestines, appendix, spleen, adrenal and gall bladder. His research interests include diseases of the foregut, surgical instrument innovation, and endoluminal therapies.

Reavis received his medical degree from Vanderbilt University and completed a general surgery residency at Oregon Health & Science University. He completed a fellowship in minimally invasive surgery at the Ohio State University Medical Center as well as several postgraduate training courses in laparoscopic surgery. He is an active leader in the Society of American Gastrointestinal and Endoscopic Surgeons, the Society for Surgery of the Alimentary Tract, and the American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery.

Pediatric Perioperative Anxiety Expert Appointed Chair of Anesthesiology



Dr. Zeev N. Kain, widely recognized for his work helping children through the stress and pain of surgery, has been named professor and chair of UC Irvine's Department of Anesthesiology.

Kain, who was appointed after a national search, also serves as UC Irvine Medical Center's anesthesiologist in chief and as associate dean for clinical research in the School of Medicine.

He was executive vice chair of anesthesiology at Yale University School of Medicine and anesthesiologist in chief and director of the Pediatric Surgery Center at the Yale-New Haven Children's Hospital.

"The recruitment of Zeev Kain is a boon for the Department of Anesthesiology and for all of UC Irvine Health Affairs," said Dr. David N. Bailey, vice chancellor for health affairs and dean of the School of Medicine. "He brings inspired leadership to anesthesiology and will be instrumental in spearheading new research initiatives."

Kain's department provides continuous coverage for all of the professional services at UC Irvine Medical Center and affiliated clinics, including surgery, obstetrics, pediatrics, radiology, gastroenterology, emergency and trauma medicine, and acute and chronic pain management.

"Our vision for the department is not only to expand the exceptional clinical care now provided by growing the pain service and enhancing subspecialties, but also to establish national prominence in education and research in pain and anesthesia," Kain said. "The opening of the new university hospital in 2009 creates exciting opportunities for the Department of Anesthesiology and UC Irvine Healthcare."

Kain is an international expert in the clinical management of fear, anxiety and pain in children undergoing surgery. Examining both the problem itself and ways to treat anxiety and pain, Dr. Kain's research has revolutionized the care of children in surgical settings. As a direct result of his work, significantly fewer children in the US and around the world are taken into operating rooms and sedation suites awake, alone and crying.

News in Brief

UC Irvine Healthcare's **Heart Failure Program** and **Stroke and Cerebrovascular Center** have both received Disease-Specific Care Certification from The Joint Commission. The commission recertified the Stroke and Cerebrovascular Center, which was among the first in the state to achieve the recognition when it was initially certified in 2004. The Heart Failure Program's recent certification is the first in Southern California.

Dr. Alpesh Amin, professor of medicine and vice chair of Clinical Affairs and Quality Assurance, has been appointed interim chair of the Department of Medicine. Dr. Amin replaces **Dr. Allan Hubbell**, who is stepping down as chair to assume the position of senior associate dean for academic affairs in the School of Medicine. Amin currently heads the Division of General Internal Medicine and Primary Care and is executive director for the UC Irvine Health System Hospitalist program. Recently he was selected to serve on the American Board of Medical Specialties' committee to design a new board certification for hospital medicine.

UC Irvine otolaryngologist **Dr. Roger L. Crumley** has been elected president of the American Laryngological Association, an organization of physicians and scientists with expertise in disorders of the larynx and upper respiratory tract. He presided over the association's recent 130th annual meeting in Scottsdale.

The Department of Dermatology has added the **Fraxel Re:pair™ laser** at its new Irvine Spectrum clinic, making it among the first in the country to offer

this groundbreaking treatment that can tighten skin and remove wrinkles with few side effects. Led by chairman **Dr. Christopher Zachary**, department researchers helped to develop this laser treatment.

Dr. John P. Fruehauf was recently named a "Top Oncologist" by the Consumers Research Council of America. Fruehauf's selection to the council's 2007 Guide to America's Top Oncologists was based on several factors, including his extensive training, experience and board certification in his specialty. His research is focused on mechanisms of drug action and resistance with the goal of improving therapeutic outcomes for cancer patients.

Physicians at **Joslin Diabetes Center at UC Irvine** have received certificates from the National Committee for Quality Assurance and American Diabetes Association's Diabetes Physicians Recognition Program. The program acknowledges physicians who consistently provide patients with high-quality care. Joslin Diabetes Center is the only UC diabetes center to receive this distinction.

"**Gastroenterology & Hepatology Symposium**," a three-day CME course presented by UC Irvine's H.H. Chao Digestive Disease Center, will be held Sept. 26-28 at the Hyatt Grand Champions Resort, Villa and Spa in Indian Wells, Calif. The symposium will address topics including esophageal disorders, pancreas and biliary diseases, interventional endoscopy, obesity and bariatric surgery, viral hepatitis, cirrhosis, metabolic liver disease and inflammatory bowel disease.
